“ The Organic District

The Regional Organic District “Sardegna Bio,” organized as a participatory foundation with legal status, is a territorial governance body designed to guide the transition to organic management of Sardinian agri-food companies toward an increasingly green and sustainable future. It was established in 2020 in response to the need for organic farms to make their voices heard at the regional level by mediating the “Green Deal,” the “Farm to Fork” strategy designed by Europe. The District is a geographical area naturally suited to organic farming, in which the various players in the territory (farmers, private citizens, associations, tour operators, and public administrations) have entered into an agreement for the sustainable management of resources, focusing on organic production that involves all links in the supply chain up to consumption. The area involved could only encompass the entire regional territory, a treasure trove of high-quality typical products. Today, the District is also a Food District registered in the national register and is at the forefront of supporting agri-food companies in all phases of the organic transition: from organic certification, liaising with control companies to facilitate the administrative process, to strengthening them through participation in national tenders, without neglecting promotion and marketing through participation in trade fairs and the creation of ad hoc events with protagonists. The District also plays a leading role in the network of national organic districts and in the consultation of regional food districts, with the aim of bringing the concerns of agri-food companies to the political arena where decisions affecting the sector are made. At the forefront of everything related to sustainability, climate change, biodiversity, and rational management of natural resources, the District actively works to promote the organic sector, including in schools, to raise awareness of organic farming. It also partners with technical courses for professionals and even offers lessons at the University of the Third Age.

The supply chains

The Sardegna Bio Organic District is organized into eight supply chains that represent the island's organic agriculture in an integrated way, promoting local production, territories, and knowledge.

The **meat supply chain**, led by the **Consorzio di Tutela dell'Agnello di Sardegna IGP** (Sardinian Lamb Protection Consortium), focuses on organic sheep farming. It promotes animal welfare, natural grazing, and traceability, protecting a product that is symbolic of Sardinia and guaranteeing quality, territorial identity, and economic sustainability for farmers.

The **wine supply chain**, led by **Tenute Dettori**, interprets organic wine as an expression of the territory. It is based on environmentally friendly agronomic practices, the promotion of native grape varieties, and a cultural vision of wine linked to the landscape and local history.

The **cereal supply chain**, coordinated by the **Tanda & Spada** pasta factory, aims to revive traditional Sardinian grains grown organically. The goal is to strengthen production autonomy, improve flour quality, and support short supply chains that bring together farmers, processors, and consumers.

The **beekeeping supply chain**, led by **Liune nomadic beekeeping**, protects organic beekeeping and biodiversity. Honey and honey products become indicators of ecosystem health and tools for promoting rural areas, thanks to practices that respect bees and the environment.

The **dairy supply chain**, led by **Coile Iscalas**, promotes organic milk and cheese obtained from sustainable farms. Dairy tradition and innovation come together to offer quality products linked to the territory and sustainable local breeds.e.

The **fruit and vegetable supply chain**, coordinated by **Consorzio Agro.Bio.Rete**, promotes fresh, organic, seasonal, and local produce. It strengthens producer organizations and market access, supporting healthy and conscious eating.

The **olive oil supply chain**, led by **Roberto Lecca**, promotes Sardinian organic extra virgin olive oil, focusing on quality, varietal identity, and sustainable cultivation.

The **wool supply chain**, led by **Mariantonia Urru**, recovers a traditionally marginalized material, transforming it into a cultural, artisanal, and economic resource, a symbol of the circular economy and sustainable innovation.

Finally, the **medicinal herb supply chain** of the Sardegna Bio Organic District, led by the company **Fragus e Saboris de Sardigna**, promotes the organic cultivation and processing of aromatic and medicinal plants. It promotes quality, traceability, biodiversity, and traditional knowledge linked to the Sardinian territory.
